




- China economy slowing down
- ASEAN-5 GDP growth in 2024 and forecasted to grow in 2025
- Thailand GDP growth in 2024 and forecast to grow further in 2025, with key drivers being tourism and private consumption
- Thai Baht has been volatile during 2024 and is expected to weaken in 2025, with pressure from geo-political changes

China / Steel



In 2024, steel exports from China increased 22.7% y-o-y to 110.7 Million tons.

The increasing trend started from 2020 and is continuing.

Meanwhile, crude steel production in China has shown very marginal reduction and despite the same, exports from China has been massive.




China crude steel production and China FG export (Unit : Million tons)

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Thailand / Steel



• Steel consumption in Thailand has been reducing for more than 6 years.

• The consumption in 2023 was 12% lower than 2019. In Jan-Nov 2024, the steel consumption further reduced 1.2% YoY.

- Like overall steel consumption, Thailand Long Product Steel Consumption during Jan-Nov 2024 reduce 3.2% while import increase 5.8%
- The reduced consumption of long products reflects slower construction activity and perhaps, delays in government disbursement for project implementation

Thailand / Steel wire rod imports

During Jan-Nov 2024 compared to Jan-Nov 2023,

• Imports into Thailand increased 13%.

• Imports from China increased 50% (during, 11 months of 2024, imports from China were 54% of total imports)

All domestic wire rod producers have considerably reduced their capacity utilization.








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Quarterly Operating Performance

Low domestic demand was mitigated by higher export sales.











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Quarterly Operating Performance

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- Thai economy in Q4/CY24 is expected a grow at rate of 4% YoY. For 2025, the economy forecasts to improve slightly to 2.9%, driven by normalized government spending following delays in 2024, accelerated public investment, continued recovery in the tourism sector and growth of private investment expansion following government stimulus measures.
- Presently, however, Investment is still struggling with a slow recovery in overall confidence and challenges. Private investment growth is likely to recover in 2025 but limited by weak sentiment and challenges in attracting FDI.
- The domestic steel demand should improve when supported by accelerating disbursement of public investment budgets.
- There will be more trade protectionist measures across the world, and also from the USA. The impact of such changes will need to be watched.







SCSC, NTS, SISCO, TSTH – Conducted a blood donation activity with 68 employees participating.




